**WHITE PLAINS MY BROTHER'S KEEPER TO HOST HUGH B. PRICE, FORMER PRESIDENT
OF THE NATIONAL URBAN LEAGUE, TO PRESENT HIS NEW BOOK
"THIS AFRICAN AMERICAN LIFE"**

White Plains, NY – April 12, 2018. The White Plains My Brother's Keeper program will host Hugh B. Price, former President of the National Urban League, on Monday, April 16th, 6:00 – 9:00 p.m. in the White Plains Library Auditorium. Max Rodriguez, Publisher of QBR The Black Book Review, will interview Mr. Price for the book discussion.

"This African American Life" spans Hugh's early life growing up in the 1950's in the Columbia Heights neighborhood of Washington, D.C., at that time a segregated city. The book also discusses the barriers to advancement that he experienced. "I wrote the book for my children and to lay down my ancestry," said Price, who has lived in New Rochelle with his wife and family since 1978.

Mr. Price has spent a lifetime working closely with youth, including providing youth development programming. He has worked with the National Guard to create pathways for student drop outs to obtain their GEDs, using military services to further their skills and access opportunities. In 1992 Mr. Price wrote "Achievement Matters." Its message is reflected in the Clubmen Higher Aims programming, as well as one of the My Brother's Keeper models: Providing opportunities to overcome obstacles and offering role models.
